Intermediate School District

**I. C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District
Special Education Millage Proposal
(Restoration of Headlee Reduction)**

This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to restore its voted special education millage to the full amount previously approved by the electors for special education purposes.

Shall the current charter limitation on the annual property tax rate for the education of students with a disability in C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by 0.1171 mill (\$0.1171 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2020 to 2029, inclusive (this increase will allow the intermediate school district to levy the maximum rate of 0.75 mill previously approved by the electors that has been reduced as required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2020 is approximately \$366,849.79 from local property taxes authorized herein?

**II. C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District
Operating Millage Proposal**

This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to restore its allocated millage to the full amount previously allocated for operating purposes.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by 0.047 mill (\$0.047 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2020 to 2029, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2020 is approximately \$147,241.16 (this millage is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?
